s followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to embody and share God's reconciling love and grace each and every day, wherever we are and with everyone we meet. Sharing of the

richness of God's grace means we cannot keep quiet when we see injustice in this world. We cannot keep quiet when we see hunger and poverty in our community, in our country, and the globe. Following Jesus and living into discipleship means we must raise our voices and advocate for justice. Advocacy is one aspect of the work we are called to do as Christians. Advocacy is an aspect of discipleship.

One way in which we can work for justice on behalf of the hungry is to participate in the work of Bread for the World. This organization, directed by David Beckmann, an ELCA pastor, provides a vehicle through which we can voice our concern for the hungry. This coming fall, we will be doing the Bread for the World Offering of Letters. Letters will be available for people to sign, if they so desire, and then we will forward them to policy makers.

Bread for the World offers nine biblical themes to help us understand why we should advocate for justice in this world. These themes are important to remember as we do the work of discipleship and they guide our work as we live into God's dream for the world. They are:

- [⊕] God loves us. Jesus greatest commandments are that we love God and each other.
- Humankind was created out of God's love and in God's image, so we are to respect the dignity of every person.
- God has a special concern for poor and vulnerable people.
- God provides out of God's abundance.

Stewardship Focus for August: Meridian Township Community Resources Commission

The **CRC Emergency Needs Fund** is used to help Meridian Township residents with emergency needs such as evictions, utility shutoffs, and prescriptions. Some of the other programs the CRC oversees include:

- ► Ambulance Waiver Program Meridian Township residents meeting income guidelines may be eligible for a full or partial waiver of their ambulance bill.
- Poverty Exemption Residents meeting income limits set by the Charter Township of Meridian may be eligible for a partial, or in some cases, full exemption of property taxes.
- Emergency Services Assistance and referrals for residents facing financial crises.
- ► MiCAFE If you are 60 or older and need help applying for food assistance, help is available.

The commission is located at 5151 Marsh Road and administrated by Human Services Specialist, Darla Jackson.

Faith's Mutual Ministry Committee

Over the past few months, the Mutual Ministry Committee has been created. It assumes the duties of the previous Pastoral Support Committee, but with a somewhat broader mission. As members of Faith, we are called to care and pray for the leaders of our congregation. As such, we believe that God's power is meant to be shared with and for others. Working together and within ourselves we hope to strengthen this ministry for the sake of spreading the Gospel. The Committee, with Council's approval, sees its purpose as:

"to act with communal concerns for the pastoral leadership of the congregation. The primary functions of the committee are to keep the pastor advised about the conditions within the congregational family and to hear pastoral concerns. Together as a Mutual Ministry Committee, we commit ourselves to strengthen the life and mission of Faith Lutheran Church, a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America."

More specifically, the Committee, again with Council's and pastor's support, has defined its responsibilities as:

- Opening communication concerning the attitudes and conditions within the congregation;
- 2. Listening for early warnings of misunderstanding within the congregation being a "listening post" for the pastor and the congregation;
- 3. Assisting in conflict resolution;
- 4. Advising on the health of our pastoral ministry within the congregation:
- 5. Serving as a sounding board for the pastor in times of personal or professional stress;

- Identifying continuing education or counseling that would assist our pastoral ministry in achieving the goals of the congregation; and
- 7. Addressing concerns for the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of the pastor.

The complete statement of organization for the Mutual Ministry Committee is posted on the church bulletin board.

The Committee has had several organizing meetings and now is ready to begin its service. Our plan is hold an open session on the third Sunday of each month, probably in the library, for anyone to bring thoughts, issues, or concerns to the Committee's attention. And, the Committee will meet monthly on the following Thursday. Our first Sunday session will be after church service on August 16. At least one or more Committee members will be there to meet with you.


Men
