From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

As I write this, I am also working on Lenten programming. And, as we move through Lent, I am always reminded about the way in which life is all about dying and rising. Every day of our lives, there is something that dies. Every day of our lives, we can also find something new, some aspect of resurrection.

I believe it is possible that some of us have a rigid, static view of God and faith. It is even more probable that each and every one of us go through periods of static faith, of attempting to solidify a very **moving,** active God. We attempt to box God in and we get stuck in one place – our view of God becomes static. We do this for many reasons. In fact, the causes are too many to count and some of them often have to do with the deep pain we have experienced in life. It is often easier to live in denial than truly feel the pain. Yet, what is true in the end is that, at some point, maturing in our faith, becoming closer to God in heart and in the way we live, becomes our own responsibility. And, that always means facing ourselves, and often it means facing our pain. Growing in our faith requires us to move out from where we started from or the place where we are stuck, into an agile continuance with God – into a new beginning.

We often try to escape life's challenges, but the truth of the matter is, we cannot because whatever we do and wherever we go, there we are. We carry our **self** (and our issues) with us. I appreciate what Father Richard Rohr says when talking about this. He writes, "God comes to us disguised as our life." So, know that it is also true that wherever we go, there is also the gift of God. Even if you have tried to bury your fears, frustrations, resentments, ill-gotten beliefs, watered down or withered faith, there is God also. There is God reminding us we live in resurrection now, that we are enjoined to God's eternity now, that we are made to co-create from our divine entanglement with the Christ mystery – the goodness, beauty, and delight of a life with God. We get to delight in our salvation with God! To do that we have to move through our "stuff" and do our work. We need to be willing to drink from a deeper well of thought and teaching. We need to be centered on God, and let God do God's work in our lives.


Resurrection Now: Delighting In Our Salvation


New Six-Week Lenten Book Study begins on Sunday, February 23, at 9:00 AM, in the Library

On February 23 Pastor Ellen and Kim O'Brien will begin leading a six-week study on the book *I Can Do No Other: The Church's New Here We Stand Moment*, by Dr. Anna Madsen. This book focuses on the church's response to our cultural context at this moment in time. Here is a synopsis of the book:

There are two gods currently competing for our collective trust: nationalism and quietism. Both make a claim on our allegiance. Where will the church stand in a day that is marked by globalization, polarization, racism, bigotry, and debates about justice for humanity and for the earth itself? While Luther's Reformation centered on

justification by grace alone, Anna M. Madsen calls people of faith to a new reformation focused on standing for justice in the world. *I Can Do No Other* looks to the example of Jesus and shows how the Christian claim of his death and resurrection entails a radical commitment to justice. She explores recent examples of that commitment, including liberation theology, black and womanist theology, feminist theology, and Christian resistance to Nazism. Madsen makes the case that justice, anchored in justification, is the church's new reformation moment, one not inconsistent with Luther's theology but weighted differently to address the many concerns of our day.

Information on Plenary Sessions

10:00 – 12:00 Plenary 1 – Youth Ministry in an Era of Over-Parenting: Moving from the Thing to the Story

Youth workers know what it is to watch parents and youth participate in multiple other activities. Most families have limited time and space for youth ministry activities or youth group. Often parent(s) (and youth) express desire to participate, but say they have no time. A parent might even say, "Sorry, we haven't gotten her to youth group in the last six month, it's just that gymnastics is kind of her thing; it's really who she is." This can be frustrating for youth workers. Some respond by contending that youth ministry needs to up the commitment level and move higher up the ranking of things. In this presentation we'll together explore how this approach can't work, because the decisions parents and young people make exist inside very deep conceptions of what makes for a good life. In a time of limited time and unlimited options, youth ministry can't—and I'll show, *shouldn't*—compete in ranking of important activities. Youth ministry should not be just another *thing* (like basketball, violin, or debate club). Instead, we should turn toward story to reimagine what youth ministry can be for.

12:45 – 3:00 Plenary 2 – Faith Formation in a Secular Age: Examining the Changes Impacting Ministry

Why is faith formation so hard? We're confronted at every turn with the narrative of decline, the rise of the nones, the constant refrain to pastors, youth workers and churches that "the world is changing." But the most fundamental challenge facing the church today is that God is no longer an assumed reality. How might ministry, the church, and ministry to young people shift when belief in God and transcendence is optional? What is faith in a secular age? And how can we help form it?
