s October breaks into our lives, I am reminded of Martin Luther and his teachings. On Reformation Sunday, October 25, we will again remember Luther's work and the roots of

our tradition. While five centuries have passed, we still celebrate and hold dear the basic principles of Luther's theological understanding. "Grace Alone", "Faith Alone", and "Scripture Alone" are three phrases that summarize Luther's thinking and theology. These three - grace, faith, and scripture - comprise the very essence of Lutheranism.

- [⊕] We are saved by the grace of God alone not by anything we do; it is all gift
- Our salvation is through faith alone a confident trust in God, who in Christ promises us forgiveness, life and salvation; and faith is all gift
- Scripture is the norm for faith and life God's word to us is gift

Martin Luther viewed God's grace as an invasion of God's love in our daily lives. As Luther grew in his understanding of grace, his life was changed. He came to understand that we are accepted unconditionally by a loving God. He realized the gift of grace is not dependent upon anything we do, it is all gift showered upon us by a loving God.

Martin Luther believed that holy actions would spring up in our lives, not as premeditated works designed to please God but rather as a response to the overwhelming grace of God that is so very present in life.

According to Luther, a life of faith is one in which we recognize that, while sin never departs, grace always invades to draw us closer to Jesus. The truth of our lives is

Sixty Plus or Minus October Program


The Sixty Plus or Minus folks invite everyone to join them for their October program. There is no minimum or maximum age!


