From the Pastor's Pen...

November means the holiday season is upon us. As we come to this busy time of year, I find it helpful to intentionally focus on ways to make my schedule a bit less busy and think about gratitude. The end of the year always makes me think about what I am so grateful for in life.

Because gratitude is important in my life, I have kept this quote I once found in **Psychology Today**:

Gratitude is an emotion expressing appreciation for what one has – as opposed to a consumer-oriented emphasis on what one wants or needs. Gratitude is getting a great deal of attention as a facet of positive psychology. Studies show that we can deliberately cultivate gratitude, and can increase our well-being and happiness by doing so. In addition, grateful thinking – and especially the expression of it to others – is associated with increased levels of energy, optimism, and **empathy**.

When I think about our present culture, I am aware of how deeply we need to experience this emotion of gratitude, especially as we enter the holiday season. We are entering a time when we will see a consumer-oriented emphasis that comes at us and hits us with fever pitch. Before Thanksgiving Day is even over, stores will be opening their doors to attract and seduce shoppers. We cannot escape what is happening in our culture during this busy, bustling season of the year. However, we can intentionally focus on what we are grateful for and what is really important in life. We can "deliberately cultivate gratitude." And, guess what? What I read from Psychology Today is not new news! We find words about gratitude and being grateful throughout scripture, especially in the book of Psalms. Here are just a few examples:


