From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

This Lenten season, during our Lenten services, in addition to enjoying the music of Holden Evening Prayer we will be seeing a series of videos entitled *Forty Days: A Journey Through the Desert of Lent*.

Before light, there is darkness; before birth, there is pain. Before many of our meaningful moments in life there is a time of preparation, a time of longing. The season of Lent is the forty days set aside (from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday) to enter in to the wilderness of our souls and seek quiet, openness and emptiness. Lent is more than a period of self-denial and giving up indulgences; it is about preparation and encounter. It was in the desert where Jesus encountered the demons of his deepest temptations, but it was also where he found God's sustaining presence and love.

The videos we will see during Lent present poems that are stories about finding home. Jesus' journey is also like our journey, an attempt to capture the place of longing in every heart; it is an attempt to go back to the garden. However, as we make our way through life, we come to realize that Eden is a distant dream, a reality that might not ever come into being. We either become cynical or attempt to build our own paradise. In contrast, Jesus' life was not about this long-lost garden, but something greater – a new Eden, a new Jerusalem – a new Kingdom, something he proclaimed throughout his earthly ministry. In order to find this new home, however, the journey often takes a detour through the wilderness.

This series of videos reflects on poems for the season. I will provide a short reflection following each video and you can take home some questions to ponder throughout the week. I pray that as we experience these weekly services, the messages will lead your heart not only through the richness of Lent, but out of Lent and on to Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and finally into the hope of Easter.

NEW CLASS STARTING SUNDAY, MARCH 3RD

Embracing the Prophets in Contemporary Culture by Walter Brueggemann

This six-session Video/Discussion Class will begin on Sunday morning, March 3, during the Sunday School hour at 9:00 AM in the library. Kim O'Brien will be leading this class.

In a series of six class sessions, Walter Brueggemann, arguably America's leading Old Testament scholar and theologian, will take you on a wild ride through the poetic


prophecy of the Hebrew Scriptures. He will identify cultural contexts, putting a framework to Israel's history, and most significantly – and at times challengingly! – draw connections between Israel's sociological, economic and spiritual status and that of America today.

Created in 2011, this series will lead you through questions like:

- What was the message of these remarkable poet-prophets in their own time and place?
- What is their message for us today?
- Who are today's prophetic voices?
- How has the contemporary church been co-opted by culture?
- What steps can we take to reclaim the prophetic message of distributive justice, nonviolence, loss and hope?
- And, what is your role in bringing God's perspective to today's society?

Each session begins with a 10-15 minute video presentation by Walter Brueggemann, followed by filmed interaction with a diverse small group. Then, Kim O'Brien will lead you through a discussion of what you have learned.

Green Team Tip

(information from Consumers Energy on Energy Efficient Lights)

Switching to energy efficient lighting is one of the fastest ways to cut your energy bills. When you look at the numbers, an LED (light-emitting diode) uses up to 90% less energy than the old incandescent bulb and is 6 times less expensive to burn. If you replaced one bulb a with Energy Star LED model, the annual energy cost savings is between \$4 -\$9/year depending on the lumens emitted and amount of use. Over the course of the lifetime of the LED bulb (22 years) the savings are more significant, easily



a savings of \$80. Now, think of that savings times the average number of bulbs in your home (70 bulbs = \$5600). You will save dollars as well as contribute to sustaining the environment. It is a win-win.

Here is some information on the Rev. Dr. Lisa Dahill, presenter for the day, as well as Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Rev. Dr. Lisa Dahill

Dr. Dahill grew up in Costa Mesa, CA, and went to an ELCA college (Gustavus Adolphus) in Minnesota, followed by a year in the Lutheran Volunteer Corps in Milwaukee and seminary in Chicago. After serving parishes in Iowa, she returned to California for the Ph.D. in Christian Spirituality at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, and worked as a post-doctoral research scholar at the Carnegie Foundation (Stanford University). From there she moved to Columbus, OH, to join the faculty of Trinity Lutheran Seminary, where she taught worship, spirituality, ecology, Bonhoeffer, and the arts for ten years. Since Fall 2015, she moved back to California and is a professor at CLU, working on projects involving outdoor worship and spiritual practices along with mobilizing Lutheran and Christian resources to address the ecological urgency of our time. Dr. Dahill loves biking, hiking, backpacking, kayaking, and swimming in the ocean, and she is convinced that the creativity, community, and joy sparked through passionate love for our Earth and its most-endangered creatures (including humans) is just honestly more *fun* than any other way of life.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-1945) was a German Lutheran theologian, pastor, and leader in the church's resistance against Adolph Hitler and the Nazis. Seventy-four years after his death by hanging in a Nazi concentration camp, Bonhoeffer's life, witness and writings continue to inspire people. He was one of the most influential theologians of the 20th century, and in the words of German liberation theologian Dorothy Sölle, Bonhoeffer is "the one German theologian who will lead us into the third millennium."

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was born in 1906 in Breslau, Germany. After his receiving his doctorate in theology he served as a vicar in Barcelona and university lecturer in Berlin. He came to New York on a postgraduate fellowship at Union Theological Seminary and taught Sunday school in the Abyssinian Baptist church in Harlem. When Bonhoeffer returned to Germany in 1931 he brought with him a new awareness of racial prejudice and became one of the first clear voices to challenge the Christian churches to stand with the Jews in their moment of need. He was deeply involved in ecumenical work and became a leading spokesman for the Confessing Church, a resistance movement against the Nazis. He headed the Confessing Church's seminary at Finkenwalde (1935-37) during which time he wrote two of his most famous writings, The Cost of Discipleship (Nachfolge) and Life Together. Bonhoeffer's involvement in the church struggle (Kirchenkampf) became increasingly political after 1939, when his brother-in-law introduced him to the group seeking Hitler's overthrow. He was arrested in 1943 for involvement in "Operation 7," a rescue mission that had helped a small group of Jews over the German border and into Switzerland, and he was imprisoned at Tegel Prison in Berlin. Bonhoeffer's prison correspondence and writings were to become another well-known book. Letters and Papers from Prison. On Sunday. April 8, 1945, in Flossenbürg concentration camp, after conducting a service, he was taken away to be hanged. As he was taken away, he said to an English prisoner, "This is the end, but for me the beginning of life." Bonhoeffer died by hanging on April 9, 1945.
