From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

These past few weeks I have been thinking a great deal about what it means to live into a life-giving, daring confidence in the grace of God. And, I have been thinking about how we, the community of God's people who gather at Faith Lutheran Church, live that daring confidence in God's grace.

I see Faith Lutheran Church as a community that truly shares a living, daring confidence in God's grace. This confidence in God's grace is seen as we are intentional about our weekly gathering together at the foot of the cross for worship. I believe it is at the foot of the cross that our life as a community is continually born anew and nurtured for life in the world. It is here that we most fully discover our identity as the body of Christ, and it is from this place that we journey together as a community of Faith, living our faith through our varied vocations in daily life.

Please join us at the next meeting on Sunday, May 5th.



WHAT IS THE BIBLE?



We are beginning a new book study, using bestselling author, Rob Bell's book, *What Is The Bible?* **This study will begin on Tuesday evening, April 30, at 7:00 PM.** We will gather for this study at Kim O'Brien's home (1144 Bonanza Dr., Okemos).

If you have ever wondered how an ancient library of poems, letters, and stories can transform the way you think and feel about everything, this book study will provide you with some answers. *What Is The Bible?* provides surprising insights and answers about how the Bible actually works as a source of faith and guidance, showcasing a brand-new way of reading this sacred text. Bell takes us deep into actual passages, revealing not only the humanity behind the scriptures but the revelation that one cannot get to the holy without going through the human. When considering a passage, Bell explains the worst question we can ask of a text ("Why did God....?") and the best question to ask ("Why did people find this important to write down?") to get at how scripture can best guide us today. In asking these questions, Bell goes beyond the one-dimensional questions of "Is it true?" to reveal the Bible's surprisingly transformative power. *What Is The Bible?* recaptures this ancient library's subversive energy and reaffirms its enduring ability to inspire and shape our lives today.

GREEN TEAM TIP OF THE MONTH...

We invite you to use the Tree Benefit Calculator on www.treebenefits.com to calculate the amazing benefits of trees right in your backyard.

Understanding This Tool:

The Tree Benefit Calculator allows anyone to make a simple estimation of the benefit's individual street-side trees provide. This tool is based on i-Tree's street tree assessment tool called STREETS. With inputs of location, species and tree size, users will get an understanding of the environmental and economic value trees provide on an annual basis.

The Tree Benefit Calculator is intended to be simple and accessible. As such, this tool should be considered a starting point for understanding trees' value in the community, rather than a scientific accounting of precise values. For more detailed information on urban and community forest assessments, visit the i-Tree website.


TEST OF FAITH Video/Discussion Series – A conversational class for ADULTS during the evenings of Vacation Bible School, June 24-27
