From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

The following passages from scripture each communicate what is known as the Golden Rule.

So whatever you wish that men would do to you, do so to them; for this is the law and the prophets. Matthew 7:12

And as you wish that men would do to you, do so to them. Luke 6:31

The second (commandment) is this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these. Mark 12:8-31

For the whole law is fulfilled in one word, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Galatians 5:15

ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and the ELCA Council of Bishops recently voted to have our denomination join other denominations in a project that is being sponsored by the National Institute for Civil Discourse. Over the next year, congregations from many denominations throughout the country will be participating in a project called *Golden Rule 2020: A Call For Dignity and Respect in Politics*.

On Sunday, November 3, our congregation is joining with many other churches around the country to observe *Golden Rule 2020*. Churches throughout the nation from both different denominations and points of view will begin doing two things: 1) offering special prayers for our country and 2) emphasizing the need to apply Jesus' teachings to our politics. It is a good time to do this since the next national election is one year from now and many of us are concerned about the prospect of an angry and hateful political campaign season that will further divide and demoralize our country.
