Introduction to the day

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-8

This reading narrates Isaiah's vision of the Lord surrounded by angels. They sing "Holy, holy," a song the church sings at the beginning of the great thanksgiving. This liturgical text invites the church and all creation to sing in praise of God's glory. That glory is God's mercy toward sinners.

A reading from Isaiah.

¹In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;

the whole earth is full of his glory."

⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet

my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

SECOND READING: Romans 8:12-17


In describing the new life of faith, Paul refers to all three persons of the Trinity: the Spirit leads us to recognize that we are children of God the Father and joint heirs with Christ the Son.

A reading from Romans.

¹²Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—¹³for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

¹Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be

astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

11"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. 12 If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 13 No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. 14 And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

¹⁷"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

We lift them to the Lord.



As you have nourished us in this meal, now strengthen us to love the world with your own life. In your name we pray.



Beginning the weekend of June 5 & 6, there will be two in-person worship options as we move toward a new normal.

Option #1 - Saturday evening in-person worship in the sanctuary at 5:30 PM.

For this service:

• We are limiting attendance to 50 people.

- We encourage only **fully vaccinated people** attend this service.
- We ask that you sign up to attend this service through an Eventbrite link which you will
 receive early in the week, or you may call Pastor Ellen at 517-974-5570 by Friday morning to
 be sure you can attend.

- Mask wearing will be required.
- Physical distancing will be required.
- While a small ensemble will sing the hymns and responses, we ask that the congregation simply hum the melodies and not sing.
- This service is taking place on Saturday, because only a limited number of people can attend, and we are encouraging only vaccinated people attend. We want our Sunday service to be open to all people, including children, and many children will not yet be vaccinated.

These Saturday evening services will be recorded and then played for the online Sunday morning service.

Option # 2 – Sunday morning in-person worship outside at 10:00 AM, weather permitting.

For this service:

- All people are invited to attend.
- Bring your own chairs.
- Mask wearing is encouraged.
- Physical distancing will be required.

Answers to a few questions you may have:

1. Why are we encouraged to wear masks outside and required to wear masks indoors?

Pastor Ellen talked to health care professionals about this, and here is their advice:

We understand people who are fully vaccinated may have an issue with wearing a mask as the CDC has now announced that it is safe to be either indoors or outdoors in public with no mask. The issue the congregation needs to consider is that occasionally outsiders may want to stop by for worship and if they see nobody wearing masks, they may not feel comfortable/welcome as they may not be vaccinated, their children may not be vaccinated, and we don't want to have to turn anyone away. This proposal is still a big step forward and a good place to start. It can always be re-addressed in 2-3 months as new information from the CDC comes forward.

2. Why is the Saturday service being held at 5:30 and not earlier?

This service will take place at 5:30 because we have been told any earlier time will cut into people's Saturday plans.

Please note that we are making these decisions as part of a transition process through which we hope to get back to what will be a new normal. We want all people to feel comfortable, safe, and welcome. Making these decisions is not an easy process, and we will continually consult our health care professionals as we re-evaluate circumstances and procedures throughout the summer.
