<u>Second Sunday in Advent – Peace</u>


Leader 1: In a world where so many experience violence,

⁶and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"



The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.
