
At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By water and your Word you claim us as daughters and sons, making us heirs of your promise and servants of all.

NEW TESTAMENT READING: 2 Corinthians 3:1-3

While the Apostle Paul was the founder of the church in the pagan city of Corinth, they persistently questioned his authority. You can almost hear the whisper campaign. "I wonder if he's made it all up? All that stuff about meeting Jesus on the road to Damascus. Maybe <u>he came up with</u> <u>that</u> since he never actually <u>met</u> Jesus when Jesus was alive. What gives him the right to tell us what to do? Let's demand that he prove his authority to us. Let's make him bring to us a letter; a letter from Peter or from James, the brother of Jesus. How else can we believe him?" But Paul doesn't take the bait. Instead, he turns it around. He says to them, "You are my letter of recommendation. You are the best evidence there is that my ministry has not been in vain." Listen now to the word of God found in Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, beginning with chapter 3, verse 1.


¹Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Surely we do not need, as some do, letters of recommendation to you or from you, do we? ²You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all; ³and you show that you are a letter of Christ, prepared by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

The unprecedented events of the day of resurrection continue as the risen Jesus appears to his fearful disciples. A week later, after Thomas worships Jesus, Jesus pronounces that the blessings of the resurrection are also for those who "have not seen and yet believe."

The holy gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁹When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²²When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

²⁴But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have

seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

²⁶A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.




DIALOGUE





Bio taken from Jim Antal.com

Jim Antal is a denominational leader, climate activist, author and public theologian. He serves as Special Advisor on Climate Justice to the General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ. Antal's book, <u>CLIMATE CHURCH, CLIMATE WORLD</u>, was featured <u>in</u> <u>the Chicago Tribune</u> on Earth Day 2018, and in <u>Christian Century</u> <u>Magazine</u> on Earth Day 2019. Antal received the 2019 Steward of Creation award from the National Religious Coalition for Creation Care, joining the Rev. Dr. Gerald Durley and Prof. Katharine Hayhoe, and previous awardees HAH Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, Bill McKibben, the Sioux Nation, James Hansen and Wendell Berry.



From 2006-2018, Antal led the 350 UCC churches in Massachusetts as their Conference Minister and President. Antal is a graduate of Princeton University, Andover Newton Theological School, and Yale Divinity School, where he was Henri Nouwen's teaching assistant. In 2017, Yale Divinity School honored him with the <u>William</u> <u>Sloane Coffin Award for Peace and Justice</u>.

An environmental activist from the first Earth Day in 1970, in July 2017 Antal authored <u>a resolution declaring a</u> <u>new moral era</u> in opposition to President Trump's withdrawal from the Paris Climate Accord. The national UCC Synod passed that resolution with a 97% supermajority. In July 2013 Antal wrote and championed the <u>UCC's</u> resolution to divest from fossil fuel companies, the first of its kind in the country.

In 2009 the Massachusetts Conference UCC became the first religious body in America to <u>pass a</u> <u>resolution</u> calling upon our elected leaders to commit to policies that will reduce the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere to below 350ppm. In August 2011, Antal joined 1,252 climate activists in an act of civil disobedience at the White House hoping to convince President Obama not to approve the Keystone XL tar sands pipe line. On Ash Wednesday in 2013, Antal joined Julian Bond, Bill McKibben and others as they cuffed their hands to the White House fence. In 2016 he and other faith leaders were arrested in Boston as they sought to block the construction of a new natural gas pipeline. In 2010 Antal founded NEREM (New England Regional Environmental Ministries), which organizes various ecumenical environmental activities including the Ecumenical Lenten Carbon Fast and the 2013 "Climate Revival." In 2015-2016 NEREM inspired scores of pastors to participate in "A New Awakening: A Season of Prophetic Climate Witness through Preaching, Prayer, and Practice." In April 2016 Antal initiated the <u>UCC's Keep It In the Ground project</u> which prompted hundreds of UCC pastors to preach on climate change.

Before leading the UCC in Massachusetts, for 20 years Antal was a local UCC pastor in Shaker Heights, Ohio and Newton, Massachusetts. In the mid-80's he served as Executive Director of the Fellowship of Reconciliation (USA), an interfaith pacifist organization. Antal began his ministry as a chaplain and teacher at several schools, including Northfield Mount Hermon and Phillips Academy Andover.
