#### From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends.

In 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, the Apostle Paul writes this to the Corinthians:

"Remember: A stingy planter gets a stingy crop; a lavish planter gets a lavish crop. I want each of you to take plenty of time to think it over, and make up your own mind what you will give. That will protect you against sob stories and arm-twisting. God loves it when the giver delights in the giving." (from The Message)

I think it is rather humorous the way Paul's words are translated in The Message. However, they do get the point across when it comes to stewardship.

October and November are the months when we focus on Stewardship in our Faith Lutheran community. As part of this effort, we are called to think about the gifts we have been given and how we might share these gifts with the world around us. # ADULT EDUCATION GOING ON NOW

OR

# Sunday morning 9:00 AM Continental Breakfast & Christian Education for adults

Pastor Ellen is hosting a continental breakfast and education time downstairs in the Fellowship Hall for any interested adults. Join her for donuts, coffee & juice and be taken to a deeper place in your faith journey.

For the first 3-6 weeks, we will use a curriculum entitled *Confronting Christian*Nationalism. This three-session curriculum examines the threat of Christian

nationalism in our country. Because discussions may take longer than the time provided before worship,

Pastor Ellen is providing flexibility as we look at this three-session course, allowing up to six weeks

(if needed) to complete the discussions.

After completing our time of learning regarding the topic of Christian nationalism, we will then focus on **How Lutherans Interpret the Bible**. Each of these sessions will begin with a video by Dr. Mark Allan Powell, a
Lutheran pastor and seminary Bible professor. Each video, designed as a teaching tool for congregational
use, will be followed by a time for group discussion. The seven sessions are:

Session 1: The Word of God Session 2: What Lutherans Say About the Bible Session 3: Where the Bible Comes From Session 4: Interpreting the Bible in Context Session 5: Determining Right from Wrong

Session 6: The Many Meanings of the Bible Session 7: Devotional Bible Reading

All adults are welcome to participate in this education experience. If you have children attending Sunday School, drop them off for 9:00 AM Sunday School then come join us in the Fellowship Hall.

# **Synod Disability Learning Day**

On Saturday, October 22, our Synod is having a Disability Learning Day at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Portage from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

#### **Being Welcoming With Food**



Being a Reconciling in Christ church we often focus on being welcoming and inclusive for all genders, sexual orientations, races, ethnic backgrounds, physical and mental ability, etc. While this is certainly important, it is time to take a look at being welcoming with food.

As we continue to work through the pandemic and work towards safely having more regular events like we did before the pandemic - food is coming back! Pretty much everyone loves a

good meal, a good potlock, or just some nice treats during coffee hour. Food can bring people together, encourage people to stay and mingle and get to know each other. Food can do many things and is usually viewed very fondly. However, certain foods can be not so kind or even dangerous to some people.

As we start to have more meals, potlucks, coffee hours, and especially as we welcome both new visitors and members, and welcome members who have been with us for a long time, we need to remember different people have different needs with food. Some people just have certain preferences about what they like and don't like. Other people have sensitivities to some foods and try to avoid them. While other people have to absolutely avoid certain foods because they can have allergic reactions to them. Since often when we serve food at church, it is to a larger group, we can't know for certain what everyone needs or wants to avoid.

To help ensure our food sharing times at Faith are as welcoming to everyone as possible, please consider labeling your foods with the major ingredients, list possible allergens (like peanuts, tree nuts, gluten, fish, dairy, etc.), and consider including your name as to who brought the dish, so if people have questions they can reach out to you.
