#### From the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

First, I would like to thank you for the generous Christmas bonus you gave to me and to other staff members. I am deeply grateful for your generosity and your kind hearts.

As I write this I am thinking about Transfiguration Sunday and the beginning of Lent. We are getting ready to embark on our Lenten journey, that forty-day season modeled on Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. These forty days embody one of the most meaningful seasons of the year as together we follow Jesus to the cross.

I have also been thinking a great deal about recent events in our world. I have been thinking about the chaos, pain, and grief the people in Ukraine are facing. I find myself thinking about the challenges the world is facing as climate is changing all around us. I think about the chaos we often face within our own country. And I find myself experiencing a deep longing, a sense of hunger that yearns for peace, justice, wholeness and faithfulness, something the Bible calls **shalom**. These qualities sometimes seem so removed from the chaos of everyday life. Yet, the road Jesus walked was one of chaos, one that often appeared to blot out anything that seemed holy. So, maybe that is what we must remember as we make this Lenten journey – God lovingly walks with us in the chaos, the challenge, and the profanity and hostility of the real world. That is truly the story of Jesus' Passion.

As together we embark on another Lenten journey, I challenge you to let yourself be engulfed by the Gospel readings and the stories of Jesus' passion. Let yourself be taken up into the Passion story as we walk the road of discipleship to the cross and then beyond. The stories we hear are the stories that shape us, they give us identity, and they give us a picture of God's unfathomable love for us.

I pray you will be richly blessed as we travel this road together.

#### All Church Soup/Chili Cookoff & Movie


#### Sunday, February 5th - All Church Soup/Chili Cookoff & Movie hosted by Green Team

Due to the fact that our Fellowship Hall has been transformed into a Free Store for Knob Hill residents, we have **moved our Potluck/Movie event to Sunday, February 5th.** So, we have decided to make this event a **Soup/Chili Cookoff!** We invite you to bring a pot of your favorite soup or chili recipe. We also invite you to bring quarters (or quiet money if you wish) and we will use that as a method of voting for the best soup or chili represented! The winning soup or chili recipe will then be published in the newsletter and all of the money collected will go toward the Food Pantry Project. The Green Team will provide drinks, cornbread, crackers, and cookies.

Following the luncheon, we will show the movie, *Merchants of Doubt.* The U.S. scientific community has long led the world in research on public health, science, and other issues affecting the quality of life among people.

In the book, *Merchants of Doubt*, historians Naomi Oreskes and Erick Conway explain how a small group of high-level scientists, with extensive political connections, ran effective campaigns to mislead the public and deny well-established scientific knowledge over four decades. In seven compelling chapters addressing tobacco, acid rain, the ozone hole, global warming, and DDT, Oreskes and Conway roll back the rug on this dark corner of the American scientific community, showing how the ideology of free market fundamentalism, aided by a too-compliant media, has skewed public understanding of some of the most pressing issues of our era. This book has been made into the documentary we will screen.

On various Sundays throughout the season of Lent, Kim O'Brien will be preaching and connecting our Lenten journey to the work she is experiencing as she continues her pathway to become ordained into the Ministry of Word and Service. She is currently doing a twelve month internship at Trinity Health in Ann Arbor where she is working as a hospital chaplain. As she lives into her calling, she will be enhancing her educational experience by doing some preaching and connecting God's word to life as she is experiencing it. Here is what she says about her presence with us throughout this Lenten journey:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and immerses us into a time to acknowledge and reflect on the reality of our mortality. As Christians, we worship a God who comes to us incarnate, in human form in the person of Jesus and, during the season of Lent, we walk with him as he journeys to his death on the cross. Working as a hospital chaplain at Trinity Health (formerly St. Joe's) in AnnArbor, I regularly accompany patients and their families on their journey toward death. Our culture's denial of the reality of death collides in often devastating ways with how people are able to move toward the end of life with dignity, love and peace. Acknowledging our mortality requires a vulnerability and raw honesty that is often uncomfortable. I invite you to join me on a path of authenticity this Lent where we explore God's presence in the midst of pain, suffering, and

even death, as we remember that we are dust, and to dust we shall return.



The season of Lent begins with our 7:00 PM Ash Wednesday service on the evening of February 22. Then, we will again hold weekly Lenten services on Wednesday evenings throughout the season of Lent. These services will begin at 7:15 on Wednesday evenings.

This year, we will again hear from author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine as she delves into the history and literature surrounding the last days of Jesus' life. In six video sessions entitled *Entering the Passion of Jesus*, Dr. Levine sheds fresh light on familiar passages in the Gospels and helps us to see the passion of Jesus through Jewish eyes. Dr. Levine says that in every good story there is history and there is risk. With that statement in mind, here is the listing of each week's focus:

- 1. Jerusalem: Risking Reputation
- 2. The Temple: Risking Righteous Anger
- 3. Teachings: Risking Challenge
- 4. The First Dinner: Risking Rejection
- 5. The Last Supper: Risking the Loss of Friends
- 6. Gethsemane: Risking Temptation

Join us as Dr. Levine takes us deeper into our understanding of Holy Week.
