Introduction to the day

Baptism is sometimes called enlightenment. The gospel for this Sunday is the story of the man born blind healed by Christ. "I was blind, now I see," declares the man. In baptism God opens our eyes to see the truth of who we are: God's beloved children. As David was anointed king of Israel, in baptism God anoints our head with oil, and calls us to bear witness to the light of Christ in our daily lives.



OLD TESTAMENT READING: 1 Samuel 16:1-13

Samuel anointed David even though he was the eighth-oldest son of Jesse and did not match his brothers in height or other physical characteristics. With the anointing came endowment with the Spirit of the LORD, designating David as the LORD's chosen successor to Saul.

A reading from 1 Samuel.

¹The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." ²Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the LORD said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' ³Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to you." ⁴Samuel did what the LORD commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" ⁵He said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD; sanctify yourselves and come with me to the sacrifice." And he sanctified Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

⁶When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the LORD's anointed is now before the LORD." ⁷But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the LORD does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart." ⁸Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. He said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." ⁹Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." ¹⁰Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these." ¹¹Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him; for we will not sit down until

he comes here." ¹²He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. The LORD said, "Rise and anoint him; for this is the one." ¹³Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the presence of his brothers; and the spirit of the LORD came mightily upon David from that day forward. Samuel then set out and went to Ramah.

Because we now live in the divine light which is Jesus Christ, we conduct our lives in ways that reflect the light of Christ, so that our activity is truly pleasing to God.

⁸Once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light—⁹for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. ¹⁰Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹²For it is shameful even to mention what such people do secretly; ¹³but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, ¹⁴for everything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,


"Sleeper, awake!

CHILDREN'S SERMON

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



GOSPEL READING: John 9:1-41

Due to the length of today's reading, today's gospel is presented as reader's theater.

The gospel according to John. Glory to you O Lord.

NARRATOR: As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. His disciples asked him,

DISCIPLES: Teacher, why was this man born blind? Was it a result of his own sins or those of his parents?

JESUS: It was not because of his sins or his parents' sins. He was born blind so the power of God could be seen in him. All of us must quickly carry out the tasks assigned us by the one who sent me, because there is little time left before the night falls and all work comes to an end. But while I am still here in the world, I am the light of the world.

NARRATOR: Then Jesus spat on the ground, made mud with the saliva, and smoothed the mud over the blind man's eyes. JESUS: Go and wash in the pool of Siloam

NARRATOR: So the man went and washed, and came back seeing! His neighbors and others who knew him as a blind beggar asked each other,

NEIGHBOR 1: Is this the same man -- that beggar?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: I am the man!

NEIGHBOR 2: No, but he surely looks like him!

MAN WHO NOW SEES: I am the man!

NEIGHBOR 1: Who healed you? What happened?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: The man they call Jesus made mud and smoothed it over my eyes and told me, 'Go to the pool of Siloam and wash off the mud.' I went and washed, and now I can see!

NEIGHBOR 2: Where is he now?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: I don't know.

NARRATOR: Then they took the man to the Pharisees. Now as it happened, Jesus had healed the man on a Sabbath. The Pharisees asked the man all about it. So he told them

MAN WHO NOW SEES: He smoothed the mud over my eyes, and when it was washed away, I could see!

PHARISEE 1: This man Jesus is not from God, for he is working on the Sabbath.

PHARISEE 2: But how could an ordinary sinner do such miraculous signs?

PHARISEE 1: He is not from God!

PHARISEE 2: But such miracles!

PHARISEE 1: This man who opened your eyes -- who do you say he is?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: I think he must be a prophet.

NARRATOR: The Jewish leaders wouldn't believe he had been blind, so they called in his parents.

PHARISEE 1: Is this your son? Was he born blind? If so, how can he see?

MOTHER: We know this is our son and that he was born blind, but we don't know how he can see or who healed him. He is old enough to speak for himself. Ask him.

NARRATOR: They said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, who had announced that anyone saying Jesus was the Messiah would be expelled from the synagogue. So, for the second time they called in the man who had been blind and told him PHARISEE 1: Give glory to God by telling the truth, because we know Jesus is a sinner.

MAN WHO NOW SEES: I don't know whether he is a sinner. But I know this: I was blind, and now I can see!

PHARISEE 2: But what did he do? How did he heal you?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: Look! I told you once. Didn't you listen? Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?

PHARISEE 1: You... you... you are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know God spoke to Moses, but as for this man, we don't know anything about him.

MAN WHO NOW SEES: Why, that's very strange! He healed my eyes, and yet you don't know anything about him! Well, God doesn't listen to sinners, but he is ready to hear those who worship him and do his will. Never since the world began has anyone been able to open the eyes of someone born blind. If this man were not from God, he couldn't do it.

PHARISEE 1: You were born in sin! Are you trying to teach us?

NARRATOR: And they threw him out of the synagogue. When Jesus heard what had happened, he found the man.

JESUS: Do you believe in the Son of Man?

MAN WHO NOW SEES: Who is he, sir, because I would like to.

JESUS: You have seen him. He is speaking to you!

MAN WHO NOW SEES: Yes, Lord, I believe!

JESUS: I have come to judge the world. I have come to give sight to the blind and to show those who think they see that they are blind.

PHARISEE 1: Are you saying we are blind?

JESUS: If you were blind, you wouldn't be guilty. But you remain guilty because you claim you can see.

The gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.


DIALOGUE


