PASTOR'S CORNER

"Make me to know your ways, O God; teach me your paths." Psalm 25:4

As we enter the Lenten season this year, we are in transition. As individuals we have been through many transitions in our lives. Each one causes us to stop and think, to stop and reflect on where we have been and wondering what is next. This is where Faith is right now. It is not always an easy place to be, but as individuals we know that we do move through them. In order to do that takes a process. Some of our transitions have been longer than others. There is often a certain amount of anxiety that goes with transitions.

As Christians, we call upon God in Jesus Christ to show us the way through them. It is not different here at Faith. We are called to do the ministry that God in Jesus Christ calls us to. The people in Psalm 25 are looking to God for guidance. Our scripture verse, which we will be reciting on Sunday mornings during the Lenten season calls on God to make known God's ways and teach us God's path. This Hebrew work for this knowing is from the root word Yada. It is an intimate knowing. It is the word used when Adam and Eve knew each other, and Eve conceived Cain. Thus, it is a verb that requires loved and trust. The Psalmist is praying to embody God's way. We don't ask for this kind of intimate knowledge, unless we really want it and trust that this knowledge is safe. It is a knowledge that can determine how to live one's life.

Here at Faith, when we say this together every Sunday during Lent, I challenge us to consider what we are requesting of God. We are asking God to show us the way to live our lives as individuals and as a community. The recitation of this verse is easy, but what will it mean as God speaks to us about God's way for us? Most of us have learned to trust God, but what happens if God chooses to show us a different path than we are on. I believe that when we ask God to do this, God will answer this prayer. Are we ready to listen and give our anxiety over to God?

Each time we say this together, I challenge us to let go and listen and watch for God's path to unfold for us in our transition process.

HEALING SERVICE – February 4, 2024

All of us desire to be whole. As Christians we believe that only happens when we are connected to God in Jesus Christ. There are always things that separate us from God. Thus, our brokenness is calling us to be healed and be brought back into a right relationship with God.

Everyone is invited to come to the communion rail for the laying on of hands. You may have a specific need which you are welcome to share with Pastor Bruce and he will incorporate that into the prayer. The general prayer that he will use without a specific need is: In the name of our Savior Jesus Christ, be strengthened and filled with God's grace, that you may know the healing power of the Spirit. **The response is AMEN.**



RIC? Oh, I See!

On January 28, we celebrated RIC Sunday as a reminder and celebration of our RIC status at Faith Lutheran Church. Faith became a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation in 2017 when we adopted our welcome statement (https://faithlutheranokemos.org/about/) that expressly includes a welcome to all sexual orientations and gender identities, among many other things. At the time, this was the main requirement to be recognized as an RIC congregation. Since then, ReconcilingWorks (https://www.reconcilingworks.org/), the organization that coordinates the RIC program, added new requirements for RIC congregations including naming commitment to racial equity or antiracism, be open to calling an LGBTQIA+ or BIPOC rostered leader, allow sanctuary and other space to be used for LGBTQIA+ weddings and blessings, and make a meaningful contribution to ReconcilingWorks and the RIC program. We may need to tweak our welcome statement a bit, but otherwise we appear to be fully in line with the RIC program requirements.

Sometimes when we talk about RIC, especially when we bring up the work the RIC team does, we hear "Oh? I thought the RIC stuff was done." or "RIC? What is that?" or "Well of course we do all that, why do we need to keep a team going for it?" Hopefully the above paragraph helps with the "What is that?" question. As to why the RIC team is still active and looks to do more, even after we gained RIC status, is because RIC is more than a status, it is a process. It is a process to continuously work to educate our congregation and reach out into the community. Yes, it is primarily about LGBTQIA+ topics, but also about many minority groups that have often been, and still are, excluded from full participation in many churches. The way social justice works is through continuous actions of education, awareness, and advocacy. To be a fully open, welcoming, and inclusive church, we need to continuously remind and improve ourselves. Just like we constantly pray and study the Bible, we need to do constant work in other aspects of how we express and share God's radically inclusive love for all.

The RIC Team, chaired by Rich Weingartner, is always looking for people to help out with one time events or on a regular basis in coming up with ideas and planning events. This year we plan on participating in the Lansing Pride and Meridian Township Pride events. We would love to host an education event or two as well - about any topic, not just LGBTQIA+. Perhaps building connections with the Native American populations, looking at how our church is equipped for people with disabilities, or more anti-racism work. Mutual Ministry Committee

The Mutual Ministry Committee (MMC) meets every three months and provides support for Pastor Bruce. Mutual ministry is defined as a mission-oriented enterprise characterized by a broad vision of ministry and a healthy practice of mutuality designed to strengthen the life and well-being of the church. The MMC can facilitate dialogue between the congregation and pastor and keeps the pastor advised about the conditions within the congregational family. The specific responsibilities include the following:

- 1. Opening communication concerning the attitudes and conditions within the congregation,
- 2. Listening for early warning signs of misunderstanding within the congregation, being a "listening post" for the pastor and the congregation,
- 3. Assisting in conflict resolution,
- 4. Advising on the health of our pastoral ministry within the congregation,
- 5. Serving as a sounding board for the pastor in time of personal or professional stress,
- 6. Identifying continuing education or counseling that would assist our pastoral ministry in achieving the goals of the congregation, and
- 7. Addressing concerns for the spiritual, emotional and physical needs of the pastor.
