



CHILDREN'S SERMON

SERMON

"This is the feast of victory for our God...Sing with all the people of God and join in the hymn of all creation: Blessing, honor and might be to God and the Lamb forever. Amen."

This morning, we celebrate how all of creation reveals God's presence. This morning, we commit anew to join the Earth and all of its creatures in songs of praise and thanksgiving to God and the Lamb. This morning, we sing a song of lament for the deep pain and suffering and destruction of our common home. And this morning we sing a song of hope that God will use us, together with all who love what our Lord has made, to help heal and renew his ravaged and broken world.

Reader 1 (Jack Dingledine): Hear these words for Colossians, chapter 1: Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible...all things were created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together...For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Reader 2 (Cecelia Kramer): So we trust that Jesus Christ is the one through whom things are made, held together, and reconciled through the blood of his cross. In Christ we have been made new. Hear these words from 2nd Corinthians: So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see everything has become new. All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and given us the ministry of reconciliation.

Kim Winchell, former Diaconal Minister for Earthkeeping in our synod writes, citing Deuteronomy 30: "And what is reconciliation here, if not a restoration of right relationship between God and humankind yes. But also in our time and place a vital repair and restoration of ecological relationship, so that we and our descendants might live...There is healing work that each of us can do.

Empowered by the Spirit, we can bear witness to God's hope and unconditional love for the whole world."

Reader 4 (Vicki Monroe): All of creation tells of the glory of God. Hear these words from Psalm 19: The heavens are telling the glory of God, and firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day by day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words, their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world.

St. Augustine who lived in the 5th century after the birth of Christ wrote: "Some people, in order to discover God, read books. But there is a great book; the very appearance of created things. Look above you! Look below you! Note it. Read it. God whom you want to discover, never wrote that book in ink. Instead he set before your eyes the things that he had made. Can you ask for a louder voice than that?"

Reader 5 (Peggy Falk): And in the 7th century St. John Damascene wrote, "The whole earth is a living icon of the face of God." And in the 13th century Mechtild of Magdeberg wrote. "The day of my spiritual awakening was the day I saw, and knew, all things in God and God in all things."

Reader 6 (Ray Herek): In that same century St. Bonaventure wrote, "Every creature is by its nature a likeness of the eternal Wisdom. Therefore, open your eyes, alert the ears of your spirit, open your lips and apply your heart so that in all creatures you may see, hear, praise, love and worship, glorify and honor God." Please join me in singing hymn #556, "Morning Has Broken".

Reader 7 (Ellen Milne): In the 16th century our beloved Martin Luther wrote, "The power of God is present at all places, even in the tiniest tree leaf. Do you think God is sleeping on a pillow in heaven? ... God is wholly present in all creation, in every corner, behind you and before you."

Reader 8 (Natalie Dingledine): I wonder if maybe the first step in our work of healing creation is to grow in our love for all that God has created, all that God loves. Perhaps these words of 18th century writer Fyodor Dostoyevsky will speak to your heart: "Love all creation, the whole of it and every grain of sand. Love every leaf, every ray of God's life! Love the animals. Love the plants; love everything. If you love everything, you will soon perceive the divine mystery in things. Once you perceive it, you will begin to comprehend it better every day. And you come at last to love the whole world with an all-embracing love."

Reader 9 (Randy Royalty): Our congregation is in a covenant relationship with Michigan Interfaith Power and Light whose mission is "to inspire and equip people of faith to exercise stewardship of and <u>love</u> for all Creation." Their staff have aided and encouraged us in our quest to be "green", to be about of repairing and restoring our relationship with the Earth. We, members of this beloved community, are bearing witness to that quest most recently with the rain garden and our new solar array. In this election year they are bold to encourage us to vote with climate and Creation in mind. We invite you to take, sign, and send a Faith Votes card on the display table in our gathering space.

We want to end our "green team" sermon with a song of hope. Please join us in singing Hymn #726, "Light Dawns on a Weary World."







THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal: you we praise and glorify, you we worship and adore.

You formed the earth from chaos; you encircled the globe with air; you created fire for warmth and light; you nourish the lands with water. You molded us in your image, and with mercy higher than the mountains, with grace deeper than the seas, you blessed the Israelites and cherished them as your own.

That also we, estranged and dying, might be adopted to live in your Spirit, you called to us through the life and death of Jesus.

Enfold in your arms all who share this holy food. Nurture in us the fruits of the Spirit, that we may be a living tree, sharing your bounty with all the world. **Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.**

Holy and benevolent God, receive our praise and petitions, as Jesus received the cry of the needy, and fill us with your blessing, until, needy no longer and bound to you in love, we feast forever in the triumph of the Lamb: through whom all glory and honor is yours, O God, O Living One, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy church, now and forever. **Amen.** From sundaysandseasons.com. 

Faith Climate Action Week

Capital Area Chapter of MIIPL has invited Faith Lutheran Church to collaborate with the Lansing Parks Dept., Ingham County Land Bank, and Capital Area Friends of the Environment to plant at least 100 trees on <u>Saturday, April 27th</u>. The trees will be planted on land surrounding the Fenner Nature Preschool, located at 1526 Mt. Hope Road. This is the former location of a golf driving range.
