INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

Immersed in the promises of baptism, let us give thanks for what God has done for us.



FIRST READING: Acts 8:26-40

Led by the Spirit, Philip encounters an Ethiopian official who is returning to his African home after having been to Jerusalem to worship. Philip uses their encounter to proclaim the gospel to him. Upon coming to faith in Jesus, he is baptized by Philip.

A reading from Acts.

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.

³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

PSALM OF THE DAY: Psalm 22:25-31

²⁵From you comes my praise in the great assembly; I will perform my vows in the sight of those who fear the LORD.

²⁶The poor shall eat and be satisfied, Let those who seek the LORD give praise! May your hearts live forever!

²⁷All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD; all the families of nations shall bow before God.

²⁸For dominion belongs to the LORD, who rules over the nations.

²⁹Indeed, all who sleep in the earth shall bow down in worship; all who go down to the dust, though they be dead, shall kneel before the LORD.

³⁰Their descendants shall serve the LORD, whom they shall proclaim to generations to come.

³¹They shall proclaim God's deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying to them, "The LORD has acted!"

SECOND READING: 1 JOHN 4:7-21

We love God and others because God first loved us. We cannot say we love God, whom we have not seen, while hating fellow Christians, whom we regularly see. Love toward God is to be matched by love toward others because the essence of God is love.

A reading from First John.

⁷Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ⁹God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. ¹⁰In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ¹²No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

¹³By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. ¹⁵God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ¹⁶So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.


God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ¹⁷Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹We love because he first loved us. ²⁰Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.


GREAT THANKSGIVING



QUARTERLY MEETING

Compassion Sunday is coming to Faith Lutheran Church

Compassion International is a Christian charity that connects caring people with individual children who live in poverty around the world. Compassion helps the "whole child" with nutritional support, educational assistance, career skills, social skills, and spiritual guidance. Compassion provides resources to help children break the cycle of poverty and reach their full potential.

I first learned about Compassion International here at Faith Lutheran Church in 2012. A member of the church who sponsored a compassion child set up a table in the narthex for a Compassion event. On the table were photographs of impoverished children from around the world. I was immediately drawn to a photo of a 4-year-old boy from Peru named Cesar. I felt a deep sense of calling to help this child and our family decided to sponsor Cesar. Soon after, our family received a booklet with information about Cesar, his family, his community, and the student center he would attend on a regular basis.

Our family began sending and receiving letters and photos from Cesar. At first, the letters from Cesar were crayon pictures he drew for us and notes from staff members about things like Cesar's favorite food, chicken stew. We continued to receive letters on a regular basis. After a while the letters were dictated by Cesar and translated by staff members. Then came letters in Cesar's own handwriting with questions for us about our family, traditions, and community. As his education progressed Cesar wrote longer letters in cursive. We continue to enjoy letters from Cesar and learning more about him and how Compassion International is changing his life. Cesar is now 16 years old and in his last year of high school. In a recent letter he told us that after high school he wants to continue his studies and become a "good professional".

It has been a blessing to be part of Cesar's life and to see him grow physically, academically, and spiritually through the years. I am so glad that our family made the decision to sponsor that little boy so many years ago. Today, Sunday - April 28th, I will be hosting a Compassion Sunday event at Faith. I hope you will visit the event table after the service to learn more about Compassion International, ask questions, and perhaps even choose your own impoverished child to sponsor.
